£500.000 of core funding from national Government was allocated to the LEP for the 2015-16 financial year. This consists of £250,000 to cover core operational costs, utilised primarily for staffing, and £250,000 for additional operational costs covering; company requirements; communication and events; sector support; and the implementation of Growth Deal. A further £55,000 was received from the Department for Transport against the Sustainable Transport Programme and Transport Excellence schemes.

The Growing Places Fund (known locally as Invest and Grow), began the vear with a balance of £9.811.796 and made two loan payments during this period. The LEP also agreed some changes to this fund structure creating a £300,000 Feasibility Pot launched in February 2016 and a £3,000,000 Growth Fund.

The Growth Deal (SLGF), received £26.4 million for specific projects this year against 9 contracted schemes.
